

### Enrolled Legislation

AB 217 (Bradford D) Electricity: solar electricity: low-income households.

Last Amend: 9/6/2013

Status: 9/12/2013-Passed Assembly Floor 54-18

Summary: The Single-Family Affordable Solar Homes Program (SASH) and the Multifamily Affordable Solar Housing Program (MASH) programs will operate until December 31, 2016, or until funds collected for the above purposes are exhausted, whichever occurs sooner. This bill would, upon the expenditure or reservation of those funds reserved for low-income residential housing, authorize the surcharge collected by the electrical corporations for the California Solar Initiative to continue to provide funding for the administration of the SASH and MASH programs. The bill would require the commission to ensure the total amount resulting from the continued collection of the charge does not exceed \$108,000,000. The bill would extend the operation of the SASH and MASH programs to December 31, 2021, or until the exhaustion of that amount, whichever occurs sooner.

AB 270 (Bradford D) Public utilities: ratepayer-funded energy efficiency assistance.

Last Amend: 8/22/2013

Status: 9/6/2013-Senate amendments concurred in. To Engrossing and Enrolling.

Location: 9/6/2013-A. ENROLLMENT

Summary: Would require the Public Utilities Commission to require the electrical and gas corporations to cooperate in establishing, by June 1, 2014, a publicly available Internet Web site containing specified information regarding ratepayer-funded energy efficiency programs. Because a violation of this provision is a crime, this bill would create a state-mandated local program. This bill contains other related provisions and other existing laws.

AB 327 (Perea D) Electricity: natural gas: rates: net energy metering: California Renewables Portfolio Standard Program.

Status: 9/12/2013-Passed Assembly Floor on a vote of 65-0.

Summary: Would repeal the limitations upon increasing the electric service rates of residential customers, including the rate increase limitations applicable to electric service provided to CARE customers, but would require the Public Utilities Commission, in establishing rates for CARE program participants, to ensure that low-income ratepayers are not jeopardized or overburdened by monthly energy expenditures and to adopt CARE rates in which the level of discount for low-income electricity and gas ratepayers correctly reflects their level of need, as determined by a specified needs assessment. The bill would require that this needs assessment be performed not less often than every 3rd year. This bill contains other related provisions and other existing laws.

AB 340 (Bradford D) Public utilities: Electric Program Investment Charge: disposition.

Status: 9/9/2013-In Assembly. Ordered to Engrossing and Enrolling.

Location: 9/9/2013-A. ENROLLMENT

Summary: Would require the Public Utilities Commission to establish a program to encourage the use of women, minority, and disabled veteran-owned businesses as prime contractors and subcontractors for all grants, contracts, subsidies, financing, and activities administered through the EPIC consistent with General Order 156 of the commission. This bill contains other related provisions and other existing laws.

AB 341 (Dickinson D) Green building standards.

Status: 9/9/2013-Enrolled and presented to the Governor at 3:30 p.m.

Summary: Would require the California Building Standards Commission and state agencies that propose green building standards to allow for input by other state agencies that have expertise in green building subject areas. The bill would require the process by which these other state agencies shall submit suggested changes for consideration to be adopted as administrative regulations that include certain elements. This bill contains other related provisions and other existing laws.

SB 39 (De León D) *This bill was amended significantly from the introduced version as a vehicle for Proposition 39. It now relates to local agencies: public officers: claims and liability.*

Status: 9/12/2013- To Enrollment

Summary: Would require the forfeiture of a contractual, common law, constitutional, or statutory claim against a local public agency employer to retirement or pension rights or benefits, as specified, by a local public officer who exercised discretionary authority and who was convicted of a felony for conduct arising out of, or in the performance of, his or her official duties . The bill would also make a statement of findings. This bill contains other related provisions.

SB 43 (Wolk D) Electricity: Green Tariff Shared Renewables Program.

Status: 9/12/2013- Assembly amendments concurred in. (Ayes 27. Noes 12.) Ordered to engrossing and enrolling.

Summary: Would enact the Green Tariff Shared Renewables Program. The program would require a participating utility, defined as being an electrical corporation with 100,000 or more customers in California, to file with the Public Utilities Commission an application requesting approval of a green tariff shared renewable program to implement a program enabling ratepayers to participate directly in offsite electrical generation facilities that use eligible renewable energy resources, consistent with certain legislative findings and statements of intent. The bill would require the commission, by July 1, 2014, to issue a decision concerning the participating utility's application, determining whether to approve or disapprove the application, with or without modifications.

SB 591 (Cannella R) Renewable energy resources: local publicly owned electric utility: hydroelectric generation facility.

Status: 9/5/2013-Enrolled and presented to the Governor at 4 p.m.

Summary: Would provide that a local publicly owned electric utility is not required to procure additional eligible renewable energy resources in excess of specified levels, if it receives 50% or greater of its annual retail sales from its own hydroelectric generation meeting specified requirements.

SB 804 (Lara D) Solid waste: energy.

Status: 9/12/2013- Enrolled and presented to the Governor

Summary: Would revise the definition of the term "biomass conversion" to include, in addition to controlled combustion used for producing heat or electricity , the conversion technology used in a biomass conversion technology facility, as defined by this bill. The bill would require a biomass conversion technology facility to meet specified requirements. The bill would require the Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery to notify an air district within 48 hours of determining there is a specified violation so the air district can investigate and begin any necessary enforcement action. This bill contains other related provisions and other existing laws.

### Legislation Related to Proposition 39

AB 29 (Williams D) Proposition 39: implementation.

Status: 5/3/2013-Failed Deadline pursuant to Rule 61(a)(2). (Last location was U. & C. on 4/24/2013)

Summary: Would require the California Energy Commission to administer, in coordination with the Public Utilities Commission, the Office of the President of the University of California, the Office of the Chancellor of the California State University, and the Office of the Chancellor of the California Community Colleges, grants, loans, or other financial assistance to the University of California, the California State University, and the California Community Colleges for projects that create jobs in California by reducing energy demand and consumption at eligible institutions. This bill contains other related provisions.

AB 39 (Skinner D) Energy: conservation: financial assistance.

Status: 9/12/2013-Ordered to inactive file.

Summary: Would extend the operation of the Energy Conservation Assistance Act of 1979 to January 1, 2020, and would thereby make an appropriation by extending the time during which the funds in a continuously appropriated account are made available.

AB 114 (Salas D) Proposition 39: implementation: workforce development.

Status: 9/12/2013-Ordered to inactive file.

Summary: Would require the California Workforce Investment Board to require a grant recipient to report to the board specified information. The bill would require the board, after the first year of implementation of the program, to review and assess the program in achieving the job training and workforce development goals, identify problems and barriers, and provide solutions to improve program performance. This bill contains other existing laws.

SB 39 (De León D) *This bill was amended significantly from the introduced version as a vehicle for Proposition 39. It now relates to local agencies: public officers: claims and liability.*

Status: 9/12/2013- To Enrollment

Summary: Would require the forfeiture of a contractual, common law, constitutional, or statutory claim against a local public agency employer to retirement or pension rights or benefits, as specified, by a local public officer who exercised discretionary authority and who was convicted of a felony for conduct arising out of, or in the performance of, his or her official duties. The bill would also make a statement of findings. This bill contains other related provisions.

SB 267 (Pavley D) Proposition 39: implementation.

Status: 8/16/2013-Failed Deadline pursuant to Rule 61(a)(10)(ASM). (Last location was NAT. RES. on 6/17/2013)

Summary: Would require the State Energy Resources Conservation and Development Commission to develop and administer a financial assistance program to assist the California Community Colleges, the California State University, and the University of California with energy efficiency and clean energy onsite generation projects. The bill would require the commission to develop and adopt specific guidelines for the program. The bill would appropriate for the 2013-14 fiscal year an unspecified sum from the Clean Energy Job Creation Fund to the commission for the above purpose, thereby making an appropriation.

AB 239 (Hagman R) Energy: school facilities: energy efficiency upgrade projects.

Status: 5/3/2013-Failed Deadline pursuant to Rule 61(a)(2). (Last location was U. & C. on 4/29/2013)

Summary: Would establish the California Clean Energy School Fund in the State Treasury. The bill would transfer 50% of the moneys deposited into the Clean Energy Job Creation Fund to the California Clean Energy School Fund during specified fiscal years. The bill would require the Office of Public School Construction, in consultation with the State Energy Resources Conservation and Development Commission and the Public Utilities Commission, to expend moneys in the California Clean

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Energy School Fund, upon appropriation by the Legislature, to fund a zero-interest revolving loan program and a grant program for school districts to perform energy efficiency retrofit or clean energy installation projects at public schools.

AB 293 (Allen R) Energy: California Clean Energy Jobs Act: implementation.

Status: 5/24/2013-Failed Deadline pursuant to Rule 61(a)(5). (Last location was APPR. SUSPENSE FILE on 5/16/2013)

Summary: Would require the State Energy Resources Conservation and Development Commission, in consultation with the Public Utilities Commission and other appropriate state agencies, to develop a program to award financial assistance for the purposes of implementing the California Clean Energy Jobs Act. The bill would require the State Energy Resources Conservation and Development Commission to administer grants, loans, or other financial assistance to eligible entities for the purpose of funding eligible projects that create jobs in California by reducing energy demand and consumption, to establish criteria for the award of grants, loans, or other financial assistance that include specified matter, and to maintain a public database of the eligible entities that receive grants, loans, or other financial assistance through the program.

SB 64 (Corbett D) *This bill was amended significantly from the introduced version as a vehicle for Proposition 39.*

California Global Warming Solutions Act of 2006: market-based compliance mechanisms: Clean Technology Investment Account.

Status: 8/16/2013-Failed Deadline pursuant to Rule 61(a)(10)(ASM). (Last location was NAT. RES. on 6/24/2013)

Summary: Would create the Clean Technology Investment Account within the Greenhouse Gas Reduction Fund. The bill would require the Legislature to annually appropriate moneys from the Greenhouse Gas Reduction Fund or other funds to the Clean Technology Investment Account in the Budget Act. The bill would make the moneys in the Clean Technology Investment Account available to the state board for the purposes of providing grants to nonprofit public benefit corporations and regional technology alliances to design and implement programs that accelerate the development, demonstration, and deployment by companies and entrepreneurs of transformative technologies that would reduce or have the potential to reduce greenhouse gas emissions and foster job creation in the state, as specified.

SB 73 (Committee on Budget and Fiscal Review) Energy: Proposition 39 implementation.

Status: 6/27/2013-Chaptered by Secretary of State - Chapter 29, Statutes of 2013.

Summary: Would appropriate \$3,000,000 from the Job Creation Fund to the California Workforce Investment Board to develop and implement a competitive grant program, in consultation with the Energy Commission and the Public Utilities Commission, for eligible community-based and other training workforce organizations preparing disadvantaged youth or veterans for employment, as specified. This bill contains other related provisions and other existing laws.
